Written Homework – 4 written homeworks per week, 2 Literacy and 2 Numeracy. A parent signature is required.

Dinner money - £13.00 per week (to be paid on Monday) — To complement new guidelines in relation to handling money, it makes transactions at office level much easier if sums of money are kept separate for individual children/siblings e.g. please only send dinner money, trip money etc. in a named envelope to your child's class teacher.

Break and Packed Lunches – School following healthy break programme – no crisps, sweets, chocolates etc. to be brought to school.

Water – children are allowed to bring a recyclable water bottle to school with a pop-up drinking top. There is to be no sharing. <u>No juice allowed.</u>

Items required – pritt stick, packet of tissues, colouring pencils, 30 cm ruler, rubber – all labelled and in a pencil case please.

Key areas of the curriculum to be covered this term:-

Literacy

Reading — Banded Readers including Rigby Star, Sounds Write, Oxford Reading Tree, Harberton, Bug Club and Big Cat will be used. It should be noted that children are expected to read aloud daily as they will be required to complete activities related to the books they have read.

Please encourage children to read library books. Reading activities will be based on reading books. Core readers, banded readers and sound write readers (as appropriate) will be made available on occasions (as guided by the weekly planner).

A Paired Reading programme will be organised for later in the term.

<u>Grammar</u> - Introduction to prepositions, proper nouns, using commas, opposites and conjunctions; using Collins Book 1 as core material.

<u>Comprehension / Guided Reading</u> — Variety of comprehension material from various sources (fiction, non-fiction and poetry) and related reading activities. <u>Creative Writing</u> - Focusing on story settings, story openings, letter writing, shape poems and instructions.

<u>Spellings/Phonics</u> – Following the Sounds Write spelling programme. <u>Handwriting</u> – Joined handwriting will continue to be developed and focusing on establishing good habits at home is essential.

Numeracy

Following the New Heinemann Scheme and the school's Mental Maths scheme – in class and as part of homework. Areas to be covered:

- 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 x tables (for quick recall)
- Multiplying a 2- digit number
- Concept of division
- Dividing by 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 (for quick recall)
- Time revise, quarter past, quarter to introduce 5-minute intervals It would be useful if parents could reinforce 'Time' at home
- Concept of area using non-standard and standard units
- Money using all coins and notes to £20 calculating change
- Length introducing ½ metres and centimetres

Guidance notes are included in the 'Maths Help book' – strategies to use etc.

January/February topic - School's Cool!

- my school/schools in the past Victorian Schools
- materials: inside and outside our school/waterproofing/insulation/dissolving etc.

P.E. Kit is as follows:
