Key areas of the curriculum to be covered this term: -

Literacy

<u>Reading</u> – P6 will continue to read from a variety of banded readers and novels (including whole class reading material and related activities for each topic).

Independent reading books will be made available from a variety of schemes and used to explore reading skills and authorial techniques as part of discussions and book reviews. Bug Club is used to promote independent reading and

comprehension at your child's band. This resource is accessed at least once weekly.

It should be noted that children may not read aloud from these resources daily. Focus instead on increasing understanding of the text whilst practising reading strategies and developing vocabulary skills. Please encourage your child to read library books including those borrowed from the local Library and on N.I. Libraries App – 'Libby.'

<u>Comprehension</u> – using a range of resources we will be developing <u>prediction</u>, <u>inference and making connections</u>. To help develop these skills, please probe/question your child about what he/she is reading.

<u>Grammar</u> – P6 will complete work on adverbs, prepositions, conjunctions pronouns, direct and indirect speech, antonyms and synonyms.

<u>Creative Writing</u> – Non-fiction writing based on topic work; writing a play script, newspaper articles, a range of reports and activities linked to World Book Day.

<u>Spellings</u> – Continue to follow The Complete Spelling Programme – including written activities linked to the lists and whole class activities.

<u>Talking and Listening</u> – promoting clear pronunciation, performance skills (link to Play scripts) - working collaboratively to make decisions and give reasons etc. through activities from the PATHS scheme of work.
