Key areas of the curriculum to be covered this term:-

Literacy

<u>Reading</u> – Continue to read from a range of banded readers including extension books and novels. Children should read for pleasure as often as possible. It should be noted that children do not necessarily need to read aloud daily – instead, focus on the comprehension aspect of their reading. Use of online reading material e.g. Bug Club is either set as a task or encouraged to be accessed as an extension task.

<u>Grammar</u> – Collins Scheme is used as core material. Areas to be covered: punctuation, adverbs, paragraphs, syllables, prepositions, adjectives, apostrophes, revision of previous work and topic linked activities.

<u>Comprehension</u> – Collins Comprehension and topic based unseen texts are used weekly. We also plan whole class reading activities based on topic linked novels and non-fiction texts – to include 'There's a Pharoah in my Bath' and 'Cliffhanger.'

The Harper Collins Reading Comprehension Progress tests are used each half term.

<u>Creative Writing</u> – Based on class novel and topics studied. Areas include report writing, developing alliteration, instructional writing and poetry (Haiku)

<u>Spellings</u> – The Sounds Write programme is used – learning a range of sounds from the 'extended code.'

Numeracy

- 1) Revision of previous work
