READING:

The children will take home/have access to white/pink level readers, Sounds Write, Rigby Star, Big Cat and Ginn reading books - for enjoyment, development of comprehension and to build up their word vocabulary - through repetition, using a phonic approach and in shared reading with parents. This approach complements classroom practice.

Last term your child received a password for an on-line reading book resource called Bug Club. This will give increased access to a vast range of books - www.activelearnprimary.co.uk

All children will receive a reading book which best suits their readiness to read. We value your support with the shared reading at home to date. Please continue to do this.

- read the title together,
- look at the front cover/illustration discuss
- question your child on the story,
- if your child gets stuck on a word, ask them to check the picture then ask them to look at the first letter of the word and attempt to say the sound it makes

Remember: Give your child lots of praise!

Core areas of the curriculum to be covered this term.

Literacy

Reading

- reading books see back for details
- Bug Club online reading books www.activelearnprimary.co.uk
- storytime related to class topics Winter, Bears, Birds and Spring
- continue to read words on classroom displays and on the word wall
- continue to participate in modelled and shared reading to develop text
- children will continue to take home library books on a weekly basis
- 'Word of the week' build up word recognition through phonic and whole word approach words covered so far: mum, dad, I, look, A, in, at, am, my, the, you, and, can, it and is (please revise keywords in word/sound book)

Comprehension

- through oral work question children on their understanding of stories and reading books which go home

- Picture inferences to develop comprehension skills
- Sequencing pictures to retell the shared story.
- Follow basic instructions to complete a task

Writing

- continue to learn correct formation of one new letter sound per week
- personal news write a sentence/copy a sentence
- topic work lists, labelling, mind maps
- children will be able to write their Christian name using correct letter formation

Phonological Awareness

We follow the Sounds-Write programme.

Sounds covered so far:- m a t s i n o p - please revise for sound recognition. Blend above sounds to make new words e.g. pop, mop, nap, pin, pip, nip, mat, sat, pan, pit etc

Initial sounds – sort objects into sets beginning with the same sound. Introduce the sounds:- b c g h d v e k l f Rhymes

Numeracy

- oral counting 0-20
- sequence number cards 0 to 10; conservation of number 1 to 10
- number rhymes, stories and songs
- counting using computer programmes
- 'Number time' 1-10/Number blocks
- investigate ways of making numbers 1-5 using numicon e.g. 3 and 2, 5 and 0
- simple maths games using counters and dice
- making sets of winter pictures
- revisit positional language e.g. under, on top of, beside etc.
- sequencing 3 colours.... finish a pattern
- matching activities; opposites
- length long and short, longer than and shorter than. Practical measurement tasks using nonstandard units and measurement e.g. cubes

- Izak 9 order numbers/build 2d shapes
- problem solving tasks
- sorting objects for 1 and 2 criteria
- data handling e.g. I like pancakes/I do not like pancakes
- ordering objects according to size smallest to largest/largest to smallest
- revision of all 2D shapes and introduction of simple 3D shapes
- volume full, half full and empty
- money recognition of the coins, 1p, 2p, 5p and £1 and counting amounts up to 10p

- programming Beebot to travel along a number line

Topics to be covered in The World Around Us and Play:
