PRIMARY SEVEN

Key areas of the curriculum to be covered this term: -

Literacy

Reading

Continue to read a wide range of fiction from class novels, library books etc. Develop children's skills to select and extract appropriate information in relation to topic work/non-fiction text.

Novel Studies - e.g. Matt's Million and Wildflower Girl

<u>Grammar</u> – Spelling rules, conjunctions, double negatives, changes in language, investigations of root words, regular/irregular verbs, proverbs and similes.

<u>Comprehension</u> – Collins Comprehension and On Target English – Core Materials. Use the skills of skimming, scanning and summarising – topic related comprehension. <u>Talking and Listening</u> – Pupils continue to have opportunities to work collaboratively and address others.

<u>Creative Writing</u> – Report writing, narrative writing, writing for a younger audience, questionnaires, interviews, using argument and persuasive language in speeches and debates.

<u>Spellings</u> – Following the Complete Spelling Programme (with variations). Prefixes and suffixes will be explored in detail.

<u>ICT</u> – research, animation, data base and computer programming activities, creative moving images.

Numeracy

<u>Number</u>

- Mental calculation strategies and pencil and paper procedures.
- Calculator skills and using a calculator effectively.
- Financial capability topics including a visit to a local bank (if feasible).
- Fractions, decimals, percentages, ratio and proportion

Handling Data/Measures:

- Comparing different methods of presenting data
- Extracting and interpreting data from a computer database
- Work on spread sheets
- Time 24-hour clock, introduce the second
- Work on time-zones to appreciate different times around the world

Topics to be covered in The World Around Us -

Money Wise:

Investigating financial capability in practical situations – includes a visit to a bank (if feasible), Young Enterprise, history of trade etc. Money past, present and future – World trade.

Titanic:

Construction, history of ship building, world travel, impact of this disaster, exploring scientific theories linked to Titanic etc.

A trip to TITANIC BELFAST is planned for March 14th. Details about this and other trips will be detailed closer to the time.

Other relevant information:

P.E. Kit is as follows: Model P.E. blue top, red shorts, royal blue kneehigh socks and trainers. In colder weather: Navy or black leggings/ thermals can be worn under the shorts (no coloured/ patterned leggings or tracksuit bottoms). Sweatshirts can also be worn over the P.E. top.
